KEY STORYLINES

- LIV Golf begins the second half of its 2024 league schedule by making its first-ever appearance in Texas
- Texas becomes the 11th different state to host a LIV Golf tournament and will also host the season-ending Team Championship at LIV Golf Dallas on Sept. 20-22
- Five-time major winner Brooks Koepka, captain of Smash GC, makes his first LIV Golf start since winning the previous event in Singapore when he became the first player to win four LIV Golf individual titles
- The all-Australian Ripper GC, captained by Cameron Smith, will look to win its third consecutive team title after celebrating trophies in Adelaide and Singapore

SUCCESS IN HOUSTON

The Golf Club of Houston, the venue for LIV Golf Houston, hosted the Houston Open between 2003-19, with five current LIV Golf players winning titles at the course:

- Paul Casey (Crushers GC), 2009 via playoff
- Anthony Kim (Wild Card), 2010 via playoff
- Phil Mickelson (HyFlyers GC), 2011 by 3 strokes
- Matt Jones (Ripper GC), 2014 via playoff
- Ian Poulter (Majesticks GC), 2018 via playoff

Kim's win in 2010 was the last of his four pro victories before retiring two years later due to injuries. Poulter's win in 2018 is the most recent of his 17 professional victories, while Jones' win in 2014 was the first of his four pro wins.

LIV Golf players **Carlos Ortiz** (2020) and **Jason Kokrak** (2021) also have enjoyed success in Houston, winning the Houston Open after its move to Memorial Park.

- Bryson DeChambeau, whose Crushers GC leads the season-long team points race, makes his first start since finishing solo second at the PGA Championship
- Legion XIII Captain Jon Rahm is the only player to finish inside the top 10 in each of the first seven tournaments this season
- Koepka, Smith, DeChambeau and Rahm are among 12 LIV Golf players who will compete in next week's U.S. Open at Pinehurst
- Torque GC Captain Joaquin Niemann leads the season-long Individual Championship race after winning twice earlier this season
- Cleeks GC's Richard Bland returns to action after winning the Senior PGA Championship in his senior major debut
- Houston-area resident Patrick Reed is seeking his first career LIV Golf victory

At the core of LIV Golf regular-season tournaments are the simultaneous individual and team competitions that create the sport's most unique competition. As the LIV Golf League heads into its second full year, adjustments have been made to enhance the drama and build on the world-class fields that compete across the globe.

HOW IT WORKS

TEAM

- Team standings for the regular season will determine the seeds for the season-ending Team Championship
- The top three teams at the end of the regular season receive first-round byes
- Team points are awarded at each regular-season tournament to the top eight finishers

INDIVIDUAL

- Individual points earned throughout the season will be used to calculate the individual standings
- The highest-ranked player following the Individual Championship event will be named the 2024 Individual Champion
- The top three players at the end of the regular season will earn individual bonuses

LOCK ZONE

Players finishing in the top 24 at the end of the Individual Championship secure their 2025 spot in the LIV Golf League

OPEN ZONE

Players finishing 25-48 are open to potential trade, release or re-signing by their team

DROP ZONE

Players finishing 49 and below are relegated out of the LIV Golf League and qualify for LIV Golf Promotions

- Designed by famed architect Rees Jones and major champion David Toms, the Tournament Course at the Golf Club of Houston opened in 2005 and was created to host elite professional golf tournaments
- The course becomes the first in Texas to host a LIV Golf tournament
- Golf Digest ranks the course as one of the top 50 in Texas and one of the best public courses in the state
- The Golf Club of Houston hosted the Houston Open until 2019, with LIV Golf players Paul Casey (Crushers GC), Anthony Kim (Wild Card), Phil Mickelson (HyFlyers GC), Matt Jones (Ripper GC) and Ian Poulter (Majesticks GC) winning titles
- The course features multi-tiered greens, strategic bunkers and several water hazards
- The 315-yard par-4 12th should be drivable each day
- The 487-yard par-4 18th is guarded by a lake down the left side of the fairway and bordering the entire left side of the green

REED'S HOMETOWN EVENT

Patrick Reed, who was born in Texas and lives in The Woodlands outside Houston, returns home for LIV Golf's first tournament in the state. "The crowds are going to be absolutely insane," the 4Aces GC star said. "I've been talking to so many people

around here ... and they're all pumped and excited for it."

Reed made four starts at the Golf Club of Houston when it hosted the Houston Open in the ramp-up to the Masters. He's eager to play the Tournament course when it's not prepped for Augusta National-type conditions. "I'm really looking forward to actually seeing that golf course, how it's supposed to be played," Reed said. "We get to actually show the beauty of that golf course."



PLAYER NOTES

Recent news and results involving LIV Golf players.

RICHARD BLAND

The 51-year-old Cleeks GC veteran making his first start in a senior tournament, won the Senior PGA Championship at Harbor Shores in Michigan. His closing 8-under 63 was the lowest round of the week as he finished at 17 under for a threestroke victory. Bland dedicated the win to his older brother Heath, who is battling cancer. "I'm just so pleased that I could do this for him," Bland said. "This doesn't feel like it's my tournament, it's his." With the victory, Bland receives exemption in select other senior majors as well as next

year's PGA Championship.

The 124th U.S. Open will be held next week at Pinehurst No. 2 in North Carolina. A total of 12 LIV Golf players are in the field, including five past U.S. Open champions.

- Bryson DeChambeau (Crushers) 2020 winner
- Dustin Johnson (4Aces) 2016 winner
- Martin Kaymer (Cleeks) 2014 winner at Pinehurst
- Brooks Koepka (Smash) Back-to-back winner in 2017-18
- Jon Rahm (Legion XIII) 2021 winner

In addition, two other LIV golfers are exempt via their recent major victories – **Phil Mickelson** (HyFlyers) and **Cameron Smith** (Ripper). Mickelson, a six-time major winner, can complete the career grand slam with a U.S. Open victory.

Other qualifiers include **Tyrrell Hatton** (Legion XIII), **Adrian Meronk** (Cleeks), **Dean Burmester** (Stinger) and Fireballs youngsters **Eugenio Chacarra** and **David Puig**. The 24-year-old Chacarra will make his first major start after earning a qualifying spot in Dallas, while the 22-year-old Puig took medalist honors in California.

BRYSON DECHAMBEAU

The Crushers GC captain continued his impressive form in majors this season, finishing solo second by one shot to Xander Schauffele at the PGA Championship at Valhalla in Kentucky. Shooting a final-round bogey-free 7under 64, the 30-year-old DeChambeau finished at 20 under- a score that would've been good enough to win any of the previous 467 men's majors. "Definitely disappointing, but one that gives me a lot of momentum for the rest of the majors," said DeChambeau, who tied for sixth at the Masters in April, his best result at Augusta National.

Solo 2nd at PGA Championship

KIERAN VINCENT

The Legion XIII member earned his second professional win with a fourshot victory at the KitKat Cash & Carry Pro-Am in South Africa on the Sunshine Tour. The 26-year-old from Zimbabwe fired a bogey-free 6-under 66 in the final round to finish at 21 under. "Any time you win, it's a huge boost, wherever it is," Vincent said, "I have a long season ahead and there's still a lot of work to do." Vincent. who earned his spot in LIV Golf this year as a Promotions qualifier, won the International Series Vietnam on the Asian Tour

in 2023.


